

WILKINSON.—On January 13th, 1941, at Dringhouses Manor, York, Colonel George Eason Wilkinson, C.B.E., D.S.O., eldest son of the late M. A. Eason Wilkinson, M.D., of Middlethorpe Hall, York, and Greenheys, Manchester, in his 81st year.

Joined the Militia in 1880 and served with the 4th Sherwood Foresters in the Boer War, when he was wounded, mentioned for his services, and received the D.S.O. In the last Great War he was Supervising Officer of the Royal Defence Corps, and received the C.B.E. in 1919. He was President of the Yorkshire Old Carthusian Club.

WOODHALL.—Previously missing, now presumed killed in action off the French coast in June, 1940, Acting Commander Eric Langton Woodhall, D.S.O., M.V.O., R.N., aged 40.

Commander Woodhall entered the Navy from Keyham in 1918 and served in H.M.S. *Glorious* during the last war, and in H.M.S. *Centurion* in the Black Sea in 1920. His first independent command (1932-33) was H.M.S. *Tiverton*, which acted as escort to the Royal Yacht *Britannia* during the racing season. He subsequently commanded H.M.S. *Acasta*, the Royal Naval Barracks, Portsmouth, and H.M.S. *Eclipse*. He won the D.S.O. in the early months of the present war.

YATES.—On March 2nd, at Yealand Conyers, Carnforth, Robert Charles Yates, aged 77.

The area which has been dug up was the old Saunderite garden, and Wilderness, to give it its correct spelling, is, apart from a spot of unasked-for agriculture by the Luftwaffe, untouched.

We may now give some details of the nocturnal visitations which we received last quarter. Early in the quarter four oil bombs were dropped on Northbrook, on grounds O and P. A week or so later four H.E.'s were dropped across the School, one landing between the fountain and Saunderites in Founder's Court, only 14 yards from the house. Very little damage was done, only a few windows and some tiles on Saunderites and Gownboys being broken. One fell on Maniacs at the S.W. corner of Saunderite Garden, one in front of Maniacs pavilion and one on Under Green. A few days later another two bombs fell, one of them in the garden of Northbrook, doing a considerable amount of damage. No one has been hurt.

During the holidays Mr Snow and a squad of fellow-carpenters entirely replaced the seating in Founders' Chapel. The old seats were tip-up concert-hall seats, in blocks of five. These have been replaced by pews from Old Chapel which were removed when Founders' Chapel and new Music School were built. By this arrangement the seating accommodation has been increased. They also moved the loud-speakers of the organ from their old position under the floor of the Chapel, whence the sound came through a grating which was usually covered by a thick carpet, and placed them behind the altar, a feat of engineering which has greatly improved the sound as well as meaning that the carpet need not be rolled back when ever the organ is played.

A new system of P.T. has been started this quarter. Instead of a quarter of an hour's P.T. in the quarter every day of the week except days when there is

Congregational Practice, and a mass parade for the whole school one day a week, we are doing half an hour's P.T. on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday mornings, when the quarter lasts an hour. This system includes coached Athletics for everyone at least one morning a week.
