I'm going to join her tomorrow for a further attack on the rusty tools, & then she is going to take grandson Jeremy & a week-long Eldersholkel trip to Strathcone Park Lodge which is specially geared for Granmas & grand children (only one grandchild). On Sunday morning the Aboriginal
